PROCEDURES FOR OBTAINING A BUILDING PERMIT TO DEMOLISH AN EXISTING STRUCTURE

A Building Permit to demolish a structure shall not be issued until the following criteria has been met and approved by the Office of Code Administration, City of Fairfax.

A Building Permit Application shall be submitted with the following documentation: ☐ A copy of the Contractor's Virginia State Contractor's License. A written statement by the owner indicating that there are no outstanding leins being held against the structure. ☐ Disconnect letters from each of the utilites companies. These include: Gas, Electricity, Telephone, Water and Cable Television. A Plumbing permit must be issued and approved for final inspection for the water & sewer lateral capoff. Please provide a copy of the Record of Inspection showing approval of final inspection. A well and septic abandonment permit, if applicable, shall be secured through the Fairfax County Health Department (10777 Main St, Fairfax VA 22030 telephone 703-246-2444). ☐ The owner/agent may need to provide a copy of the completed asbestos certification inspection report. The inspection report shall have the company's name, the inspector's name, and a copy of the inspection company's Virginia contractor's license. ☐ If an asbestos abatement is necessary, a permit for asbestos removal will be required. A licensed Virginia asbestos removal company shall perform the abatement. A \$1,000 Bond shall be secured before demolition can occur. The bond requirement can be met by any of the following: o A required Site Bond by the Office of Zoning o A bond, through a bonding agent, held by the City of Fairfax. o A company check or money order for \$1,000 payable to the City of Fairfax. This bond will be refunded after the final inspection is approved. A written request must be submitted to receive this refund. A pre-construction meeting with a building inspector must be scheduled prior to any demolition of a residential property. (this may be done either by phone or in person at the discrection of the building inspector) A final inspection must be scheduled as soon as the demolition is complete.
