## FIRE SAFETY AND EVACUATION PLANS

**IFC/2000 Section 404.1 General.** Fire safety and evacuation plans shall comply with the requirements of this section.

**IFC/2000 Section 404.2 Where required:** An approved fire safety and evacuation plan shall be prepared and maintained for the following occupancies and buildings.

- 1. Group A (Assembly), other than Group A occupancies used exclusively for purposes of religious worship that have an occupant load less than 2000.
- 2. Group E (Educational).
- 3. Group H (Hazardous groups).
- 4. Group I (Institutional).
- 5. Group R-1 (Residential, hotel/motel).
- 6. Group R-2 (Residential, apartments/boarding house/dormitory).
- 7. Group R-4 (Residential, some residential care/assisted living facilities).
- 8. High-rise buildings (buildings with occupied floors located more than 75 feet above the lowest level of fire department access).
- 9. Group M (Mercantile) buildings having an occupant load of 500 or more persons, or more than 100 persons above or below the lowest level of exit discharge.
- 10. Underground buildings.
- 11. Buildings with an atrium and having an occupancy in Group A, E or M.

**IFC/2000 Section 404.3 Contents.** Fire safety and evacuation plan contents shall be in accordance with Sections **404.3.1** and **404.3.2**.

## IFC/2000 Section 404.3.1 Fire evacuation plans: Fire evacuation plans shall include the following:

- 1. Emergency egress or escape routes and whether evacuation of the building is to be complete or, where approved, by selected floors or areas only.
- 2. Procedures for employees who must remain to operate critical equipment before evacuating.
- 3. Procedures for accounting for employees and occupants after evacuation has been completed.
- 4. Identification and assignment of personnel responsible for rescue or emergency medical aid.
- 5. The preferred and any alternative means of notifying occupants of a fire or emergency.
- 6. The preferred and any alternative means or reporting fires and other emergencies to the fire department or designated emergency response organization.
- 7. Identification and assignment of personnel who can be contacted for further information or explanation of duties under the plan.
- 8. A description of the emergency voice/alarm communication system alert tone and preprogrammed voice message, where provided.

## IFC/2000 Section 404.3.2 Fire safety plans. Fire safety plans shall include the following:

- 1. The procedure for reporting a fire or other emergency.
- 2. The life safety strategy and procedures for notifying relocating, or evacuating occupants.
- 3. Site plans indicating the following:
  - 3.1. The occupancy assembly point.
  - 3.2. The location of fire hydrants.
  - 3.3. The normal routes of fire department vehicle access.

- 4. Floor plans identifying the locations of the following:
  - 4.1. Exits.
  - 4.2. Primary evacuation routes.
  - 4.3. Secondary evacuation routes.
  - 4.4. Accessible egress routes.
  - 4.5. Areas of refuge.
  - 4.6. Manual fire alarm boxes.
  - 4.7. Portable fire extinguishers.
  - 4.8. Occupant-use hose stations.
  - 4.9. Fire alarm annunciators and controls.
- 5. A list of major fire hazards associated with the normal use and occupancy of the premises, including maintenance and housekeeping procedures.
- 6. Identification and assignment of personnel responsible for maintenance of systems and equipment installed to prevent or control fires.
- 7. Identification and assignment of personnel responsible for maintenance, housekeeping and controlling fuel hazard sources.

**IFC/2000 Section 404.4 Maintenance.** Fire safety and evacuation plans shall be reviewed or updated annually or as necessitated by changes in staff assignments, occupancy, or the physical arrangement of the building.

**IFC/2000 Section 404.5 Availability.** Fire safety and evacuation plans shall be available in the workplace for reference and review by employees, and copies shall be furnished to the code official for review upon request.
