Happenings



As of November 1st, after nearly a decade with Fairfax City Parks and Recreation, Michael (Mac) Ryan has retired. Many of you likely met or worked with Mac over the years. He was always guick with a joke and an offer to help. We certainly will miss him and wish him a happy retirement filled with uninterrupted hours of fishing.

Mac's retirement did provide us an opportunity to re-evaluate the staffing structure of the Parks Maintenance Division. Over the past decade the workload of this Division has increased exponentially while the number of staff and the organizational model has stayed the mostly the same.

During Mac's tenure the organizational structure featured a single manager with two parks supervisors. These supervisor positions managed daily crew operations, but did not have a defined role in higher level tasks. A review identified that a two-manager system would benefit the Division's ability to complete the crew's packed schedule of events, maintenance, and Capital Improvement Projects. This new structure would maintain the same number of FTE's by only replacing a single Park Supervisor.

Within the division, two candidates stood out as more than qualified for the job of Parks Maintenance Manager. Demetric Willingham has been with the City for 20 years, 17 of those years with Parks and Recreation. He brings a vast knowledge of athletic facility management, crew leadership, and event supervision. Christopher Fleming has been with the City for over 5 years with 10 years of landscaping experience prior to his time with the City. He is a certified arborist who brings a knowledge of greenspace management, invasive plant removal, and workforce development.

We are excited to announce that as of September 16th both were promoted to Park Manager. Over the next few months, we will continue to refine each manager's roles and responsibilities. This is an extremely positive development for the Parks & Recreation Department.

Parties who wish to make a request to hold a special event on public property (i.e., runs, walks, and festivals) in the City of Fairfax, must complete a Special Event Policy/Application form. The form can be found at fairfaxva.gov - search 'Hold Event'. The completed request form can be submitted to Mitzi Taylor, Event and Athletic Manager. All applications must be received at least 90 days prior to the requested date except for road-race requests, which will follow a new policy.

New policy for road-race requests: An annual deadline of July 1 will be set for all road-race request applications with an event date between January 1 through December 31 of the following year. A lottery will be held for all roadrace applications submitted by the deadline date except those previously accepted in by the new policy.





Open to girls and boys, ages 7-15, regardless of experience. FPYC lacrosse is a spring sport with practices twice a week and games on Saturdays (boys) and Sundays (girls).

RUNNING/TRACK & FIELD

During the fall, the FPYC Cheetahs running program focuses on off-road distance running (1K to 5K). In the spring, the focus is on track and field, including sprints, distance running, jumps and throws. Practices are on Sundays, Tuesdays and Thursdays.

SOCCER


