**Project Description:** This project will construct a proposed shared use path on Chain Bridge Road (Route 123) to the Wilcoxon Trail, south of Fairfax Boulevard (Route 50). The trail will be 10-15 feet wide and ADA compliant with five pedestrian bridges spanning small tributaries and Accotink Creek. The trail is primarily along the southern side of Accotink Creek, with some portions within Fairfax City Parks.

Additional Project Description: Lighting, landscaping, retaining walls, stormwater management are included in the project design. A total of five (5) boardwalks will be constructed. An 8" water main will be relocated under Accotink Creek to resolve a conflict with a pedestrian bridge

**Purpose and Need:** The purpose and need of this project is to provide improved pedestrian and bicycle access, safety, and connectivity to the existing regional network.
