

New Virginia's Medicaid Expansion!

If you applied for Medicaid in the past and were denied, you may soon be eligible. Thousands of Virginians aged 19 and 64 will soon be able to sign up for new health coverage that will give them access to services at low cost.

Beginning January 1, 2019, this coverage will be available for up to 400,000 adults, including many people who work in retail, construction, childcare, landscaping, food service or other jobs that don't provide health insurance.

The new coverage will include preventive care, doctor visits, prescriptions, hospital stays, mental health care and more. New coverage will also include care coordination for individuals with complex medical and behavioral health conditions.

How to qualify:

To qualify for the new health coverage, individuals must:

- ✓ Be a Virginia resident, ages 19-64
- ✓ Not already in or eligible for Medicare
- ✓ Meet income requirements, which vary by household size

You may be eligible if you make less than:

How to apply:

Health coverage begins January 1, 2019, but starting November 1st, Virginia will begin accepting applications under the expanded Medicaid rules.

When enrollment begins, there will be several ways for individuals to apply for new adult coverage:
