The U.S. Census takes a snapshot of America by counting every person in every household in the United States every decade.

In 2020, the U.S. Census is going paperless: people are asked to fill out their forms online.

Check your mailbox in mid-March for a postcard from the U.S. Census in mid-March with the web address of

the secure U.S. Census website and your individual code. Fill out your census form on your smartphone, tablet, or computer. The website, and your response, are secure, and all information provided in the U.S. Census is private.

NO COMPUTER? No problem: the City of Fairfax Regional Library — and all Fairfax County Public Library

branches — provide free computer use with your (free) library card.

PREFER PAPER? Call the phone number on the postcard to receive a paper form, then mail it back promptly.

Census Day is April 1 — but don't wait. Fill out your census form as soon as you receive your postcard. Households that don't respond will receive reminders, then in mid-April will receive printed reminders. An official Census Taker will visit each household that has not responded by late spring.

U.S. Census results are crucial to properly allocate state and federal resources and funding. Census results are used to distribute seats in the U.S. House of Representatives, for example, and are used to determine how to provide our city with state and federal funds, and a myriad of other important and crucial resources.

Spring Cleanup Month Includes Cleanup Day, Street Sweeping, Leaf Collection

The city spruces up, and provides special services, in April for Fairfax City's Spring Cleanup Month. 703.385.7995

On Tuesdays in April, vacuum trucks collect loose leaves raked to the curb in residential neighborhoods that receive city curbside refuse collection service. *Please rake leaves to the curb by 7 am on collection days: April 7, 14, 21, and 28. Bagged leaves are not collected in April.*

Families, service groups, and community groups are encouraged to **choose a Fairfax City location to clean up on April 25**. The city provides bags, gloves, and removal of refuse, and you provide the hard work. Can't make April 25? We'll find another day that works!

The city also sweeps residential streets on weekdays; look for signs announcing the date of the service in your neighborhood. Please refrain from on-street parking from 7 am to 3 pm on those days.

Real Estate Tax Relief, Rent Relief Available

The City of Fairfax provides real estate tax relief and rent relief for senior citizens and city residents with permanent and total disabilities. Different types of relief are granted on a sliding-scale and based on income. Qualified homeowners may choose basic tax relief, tax deferral, tax freeze, or combination tax freeze and deferral.

Virginia offers a real estate tax exemption for the primary residence of certain disabled veterans and their surviving spouses. The veteran must be declared 100 percent service-connected and permanently and totally disabled by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

Rent relief is available for senior citizens or renters with permanent and total disabilities.

Political Signs: What's Permitted

Want to post signs on your property for candidates in the May 5 City Election? Know this:

- Political signs are "temporary signs" that may be posted for up to 90 days and removed shortly after the election
- Political signs may be no larger than 10 square feet (residential) or 32 square feet (nonresidential)
- Signs may be placed 10 feet from property lines or on a fence or wall
- Property owners who display signs are not required to have permits
- Candidates — or candidate organizations that distribute the signs — need permits from the Zoning Office on behalf of property owners displaying signs 703.385.7820; fairfaxva.gov, search "temporary sign"



Fairfax City Budget and CIP Review Continues



We need you — to help determine Fairfax City's financial priorities for the upcoming fiscal year, as Mayor and City Council review the proposed budget and five-year Capital Improvement Projects Plan (CIP) for the next fiscal year.

The budget is the city's single most important document. It determines the future, funding projects and programs that lay the groundwork for the community's future accomplishments. The CIP identifies capital projects for the next five years, including the next fiscal year projects to be included in the budget.

Fairfax City Women Business Owner's Luncheon, March 18





Recent pressure in the global recycling market has prompted municipalities nationwide to change how they handle glass recycling. Glass has become both difficult and expensive to recycle. Because of this, the city is changing its approach to glass recycling to ensure the greatest environmental benefit.

The city has launched a pilot program with Fairfax County to place a purple glass-only recycling bin at 10700 Page Avenue, across from the U.S. Post Office. The Purple Can is accessible 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

City residents also may use all Purple Cans throughout Fairfax County — and chances are, there's a Purple Can on your route, wherever you're going. Visit fairfaxva.gov/recycling to access a Purple Can map.

Why Should I Use the Purple Can?

Purple Can glass is:

- sent to a glass-crushing facility in Fairfax County, where it's crushed into sand and gravel for use in a variety of local constructions projects, such as paving, pipe bedding, and backfill, OR
- transported to a glass processing plant in Wilson, NC to be made into new glass products.

Do I Have to Use the Purple Can?

You may continue to place glass in your curbside collection bins. However, in the curbside single-stream system, glass breaks and contaminates other recyclable materials, and causes issues for the machines at the recycling facilities. The best way to make sure your glass is recycled and reused is to place it in the Purple Can.
