

# City & County Voters: Notice regarding Center for Voter Information Mailing - Return Envelopes

The Center for Voter Information recently mailed absentee ballot applications to Virginia residents - this is an independent organization unaffiliated with the City of Fairfax Office of Elections or the Fairfax County Office of Elections. The form provided is a valid form to use to request a by-mail ballot in Virginia, but we're aware that the return mail information incorrectly directs City voters to mail the application to the Fairfax County Office of Elections and similarly incorrectly directs County voters to mail the application to the City of Fairfax Office of Elections.

If you are a City resident:

You may apply for a by-mail ballot online at [vote.elections.virginia.gov](https://vote.elections.virginia.gov).

If you have already applied for an absentee ballot for the November General Election, you do not need to complete a second application.

Otherwise, if you received a Virginia Vote by Mail Application Form from the Center for Voter Information and you would like to apply for a by-mail ballot, you may complete this application and mail it to the correct locality. For City voters, the address is:

If you are a County resident, feel free to send your application directly to the Fairfax County Office of Elections. Their mailing address is:
